INSTRUCTIONS

We're going to play a letter writing game.

First, **write your name at the top of the page** so I know it's your paper. Then, I'm going to say a word that starts with a letter of the alphabet. Then I am going to say the letter. You'll see a picture of that word, and underneath it is a **blank box**. Your job is to **write the first letter of the word**—the letter that goes with the picture. Make sure to **stay inside the box** when you write. **You cannot erase**, so if you make a mistake, that's okay—just keep going. I will **time you** while you work, but don't rush—what matters most is that you show me your best writing.

Page 1: Ok, let's start, the **first word is Apple**. Apple starts with the letter **A**, so you would write a big **capital A** in the first box.

Page 2: Now, let's do this again. This time, I want you to write small lower case letters. (Repeat instructions for the letter A)

Page 3: Ask the child to write the number in the box that corresponds to the number of dots. This has one dot, so you write the number 1 here.
